If it's badminton, Michael Lee seldom lets it pass. He went all the way to Birmingham, England, recently just to watch the World Badminton Championships. Last year, he took a group of veteran players to Taiwan.

When the Denmark players gave the Indonesian Open the skip and stayed in Kuala Lumpur to train for next week's Malaysian Open, Lee made sure he made a paid visit to see them train at Stadium Jugu in Bukit Kiara.

Not happy with that, he even invited the Danes over to view his 15-court indoor hall at the SS24 Taman Megah Badminton Centre in Puchong Jaya on Thursday.

"I just love to play and watch badminton," said the 50-year-old Lee, who made a special banner to welcome his foreign visitors.

The Danish players who visited the centre included Peter Gade-Christensen, Kenneth

Jonassen, Anders Boesen, Niels Christian Kaldar and former world champion Peter Rasmussen.

The players, who were accompanied by Danish assistant national coach Jan Jorgensen, later adjourned for lunch at the nearby food court.

"The players were quite impressed by the facilities at the hall especially the partitions and lighting," said Michael, who intends to build a 32-court indoor badminton complex at Bandar Puteri Puchong early next year.

"Besides getting to know the Danish players better, the visit by the Danish players was also helpful in getting their feedback about the badminton facility we have here. The Danes, being international players who have travelled all over the world to play, can offer good advice."
